> ANNUAL REPORT April 2018-March 2019

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Dhaatri Trust is a voluntary organization working for the development and empowerment of women and children, particularly tribal communities in Andhra Pradesh. We mainly work in Visakhapatnam agency area of Paderu mandal in 30-40 villages in three panchayats – Vantlamamidi, Salugu and Modapalli. Our registered office is in Vijayawada (D.No. Aasramam Street, Anjaneyaswamy temple, M.G.Road, Vijayawada) and our administrative office is in Plot No 10, Lotus Pond Colony, Military Dairy farm road, Tirumalgiri, Secunderabad. We have a field office in Poolabanda village, Salugu panchayat, Paderu mandal.

Our main activities are:

Tribal Children's Programmes:

Bringing out of school children (drop-out children) and never enrolled children into primary schools and high schools and helping them get admissions in Ashram schools. Every year we motivate parents and children to put their children in government primary schools, and particularly girls in hostels, to prevent child marriages and child labour in the tribal area. We conduct summer camps and special camps for tribal children who are out of school in order to help them re-enter school.

We coordinate with schools in tribal area in order to ensure that enrolled children are retained in hostels. We conduct motivation programmes, cultural and health programmes with students in high schools to help the teachers in student retention. We have been undertaking several cultural and academic activities in the hostels of Malkapalem Boys' Ashram School, KGBV and Srikrishnapuram, Paderu and in Talarsingi boys' ashram sch ool, Paderu. We are also working with the girls in the hostels on their menstrual health and hygiene, on nutrition and tribal food and on crafts, theatre and art activities to motivate students.

We are helping disabled children attend special camps to get certificates and special aids and to enroll them in schools

We provide student support in the form of fees, travel support, sports equipment, books and other material. We have provided the same in primary schools like Poolabanda and Kapparamajji and to individual students at higher education level.

We provide health assistance to children in emergency situation or where they need follow up support.

We are working with the village communities in making effective use of the Right to Education Act by organizing training programmes for School Management Committees, panchayat leaders and Gram Sabhas and in helping the parents and teachers in improving the management of primary schools.

We are working with PVTG children on cultural education, to strengthen the cultural knowledge and language of the Kuvi speaking Khonds. Our staff and volunteers work with children and elders in documenting tribal songs, stories, language, and develop books for children. We also undertake environment education classes for primary school children through art, craft and science classes like biodiversity mapping, food festivals, teaching tribal music and songs. We also work with children and elders in conservation programmes like protection and regeneration of springs and soil conservation and tree plantation.

We are promoting kitchen gardens in primary schools and ashram schools by distribution of seeds and our staff and volunteers help the children in kitchen garden management.

Youth Programmes:

We are mainly working with kishori balika girls in the villages to help adolescent girls in health, nutrition and livelihood support activities. Our field team works with kishori balika groups in the village to conduct training on making healthy nutritious food from local crops, making sanitary pads and health training on women's problems and herbal remedies and on social security for girls when they go for work or for migration. We also provide livelihood training for girls like adda leaf plate making, tailoring, collection of forest produce and processing food items, making tribal snacks and in basic literacy. We have taken them for exposure visits and trainings on adda leaf plate making, mushroom cultivation, preparing organic manure, jack fruit pickles and snacks, etc.

We also work with adolescent boys and girls in the hostels on sexual health and hygiene, confidence building, communication skills and improving writing skills. Our field staff, volunteers and academic resource persons help us in this initiative.

Women's Programmes:

Our main activities are to improve the livelihood and economic situation of tribal women, particularly widows and single women. In Visakhapatnam tribal area, we are working on the following women's empowerment programmes:

- Women's awareness and participation in the Forest Rights Act by taking part in the Forest Rights Committees, mapping their individual and common lands and submitting their claims for pattas. So far we have helped women in 30 village submit their claims at the sub divisional level and many women have got individual pattas. We are asking for CFR settlement and for Habitat Right pattas for PVTGs.
- Helping widows by forming widows groups in three clusters, putting up applications for widow pensions, old age pensions, pattas to be registered in their names after the death of their husbands, MNREGS job cards, application for housing and toilets and disability certificates.
- We are working with women farmers in improving the food security through promoting the cultivation of millets, exchange of seeds during sowing season, training women in organic farming and soil management through preparation of organic fertilizers, taking women for exposure visits to understand livelihood programmes like millets processing, mushroom cultivation, NTFP processing, honey and bee keeping, amla products, etc.

- National Fellowship programme for Adivasi Women on Capacity Building for Leadership in Natural Resources and Livelihoods- we are working with 20 Fellows in 7 states in India to strengthen their understanding of tribal problems, laws, engagement with governance and local authorities, and livelihood interventions with women's groups at the community level.
- We are also part of a national and regional programme on women and natural resources protection to exchange skills on livelihoods and natural resources management.
- We are helping women get job cards under the MGNREGS and for getting work and in micro planning for land development activities under MGNREGS.
- We are working with women on preventing child marriages among young girls by motivating them to send their girls to high school.
- We organize trainings and workshops for women on awareness of FRA and PESA Act, participation in PESA committees and FRA activities.
- We are also working with dalit and devadasi women to protect their daughters from becoming devadasis by undertaking training and education for women and girls.
- We work with women on understanding environmental problems to natural resources, water and forests in tribal areas and help with protection and conservation programmes in forest areas.
- We help university students and academic and non-academic institutions undertake research on tribal women's problems, natural resources, education and socio-cultural problems through conducting field data collection and surveys in villages and schools.
